## Ophthalmology

Veterinary ophthalmologists specialize in the diagnosis, treatment, and surgery of conditions involving the eyes, such as glaucoma, uveitis, cataracts, corneal trauma, and more. Our board-certified veterinary ophthalmologist is trained to diagnose and treat animals of any species (small animals, large animals, wildlife, and exotics) except humans.

## EYE DISEASES, PROCEDURES AND SURGERIES

Some common diseases are corneal ulcers and lacerations, glaucoma, cataracts, keratoconjunctivitis sicca (dry eye), conjunctivitis entropion, infectious diseases, uveitis, retinal detachments, ocular trauma and foreign bodies, prolapse gland of the third eyelid, intraocular and eyelid masses, and congenital/hereditary abnormalities. Available specialized diagnostic testing includes indirect ophthalmoscopy, tonometry, tear testing, corneal staining, high-frequency ocular ultrasound, electroretinograms for retinal function testing, and more. Ophthalmology surgeries include grid keratotomy, phacoemulsification cataract surgery, intraocular lens replacement, corneal and intraocular microsurgery, corneal transplants and conjunctival grafts, diode lase ablation, enucleation, eyelid and orbital mass removals, electrolysis, cryotherapy, "cherry" eye, corneal foreign bodies, conjunctival cyst removal, lensectomy, and more.
